1	Based on correspondence with the Town the proposed collector road through
	the Corseed Subdivision is the preferred alternative for the collector road.
2	Figure 19 in the revised TIS provides a preliminary intersection layout. The
	revised analysis includes a review of the sight distance for the proposed
	intersection alignment.
3	As outlined above, Figure 19 in the revised TIS provides a preliminary
	intersection layout.
4	The report has been revised to include a sight distance review at the
	intersection of Street A and Street B in the Corseed Subdivision.
5	Section 5.4 in the revised TIS provides a preliminary review of the access
	opportunities for the Mixed-Use Block and the Commercial Block. A more
	detailed review will be provided in the Site Plan Approval phase for these blocks.
6	The percentage of existing traffic travelling north using the collector road has
	been increased from 20% to 30%. The adjacent developments traffic assignment
	has been revised to include a percentage of traffic travelling north using the
	collector road once constructed. The proposed development traffic assignment
	has been revised to include a percentage of traffic travelling southeast using the
	collector road extension via Industrial Drive once constructed.

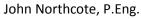

We had the TIS peer reviewed to help bring this along. Our consultant's findings are below.

Scott

This is the third version of the TIS. Notable changes are:

- It is for the Corseed development on the west side of CR 25 only. Earlier versions were for both the Corseed and Moco developments. It still considers future traffic from the Moco development in total future traffic estimates, but makes no specific recommendations in regard to the Moco subdivision.
- The lay-out of the development has been revised to provide a collector road standard through it. This appears
 to be to providing for the proposed future major collector identified in the Grand Valley Transportation Master
 Plan (GVTMP).
- 1 It should be clarified with the Town if indeed this road is being planned as Option B of the preferred alternative in the GVTMP. It may be that the Town wishes to keep this option open, and a final decision has not been made yet. If this is

to be the route of the future collector, than the proposed intersection should be reviewed considering that it will be a significant intersection of an Arterial and Collector in future, and will certainly be signalized.

The access location is still proposed to be directly across from Industrial Road, and it is further assumed that Industrial Road will form part of the future major collector. With reference to the attached Draft Plan, we have identified the following potential concerns with the configuration:

- 2 Industrial Road intersects at a skew angle, which will make it difficult to provide a smooth alignment through the intersection
- 3 Sharp curves in the alignment on both the east (existing Industrial Drive) and west (new subdivision) sides of the intersection, raising sight distance and operational concerns
- 4 Proximity of the proposed Street B intersection to CR 25, and sight distance concerns from this location.
- 5 Future access to the Mixed Use Block and Commercial Block would be in close proximity to the CR 25 intersection and on a curve.

We recommend that a functional design of this future intersection be prepared to determine whether it is suitable for the expected future use.

In terms of the traffic analysis, the TIS assumed that the east leg of the future collector would be in place by 2026, and assigned a percentage of existing traffic (20%) to it. They did not assign any development traffic to it, assuming that all traffic from their development would use CR 25. Also, they did not assume that the future collector road to the Northwest would be in place, and therefore have not assigned any future traffic from adjacent developments to this leg. When the collector is constructed to the north as envisaged by the GVTMP, significantly higher volumes of traffic will use this leg, and this will affect the intersection design.
